Step Throat has been reported in Maple Elementary

Most common symptoms are fever, red throat (with or without pus spots), and tender and swollen neck glands. *Scarlet Fever* includes all of the aforementioned symptoms plus rash on skin and inside of mouth and a “strawberry tongue.” Symptoms may vary. Some children may generally not feel well, have no fever or a low grade fever, loss of appetite, headache, and stomachache. Diagnosis is made by a throat culture. Students may return to school 24 hours after antibiotics have been started. Early diagnosis and treatment are essential in preventing serious complications of untreated strep such as rheumatic fever or kidney disease. Because strep throat is spread like a cold, encourage your child to use good hygiene practices such as proper use and disposal of tissues, frequent hand washing (including under fingernails), and keeping fingers and hands away from the face. These good practices will help decrease the likelihood of getting so many colds or strep throat.

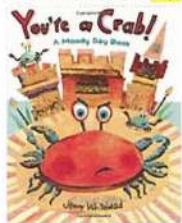

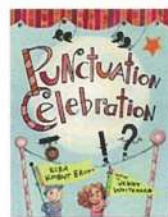
