
Please consider the following definitions when completing this worksheet:	
 Gun-Related Violence: Guns and other weapons used in an unlawful way to cause harm of death regardless of intention. Public Mass Shootings: One in which four or more people selected indiscriminately, not including the perpetrator, are killed. Prevent: Keep (something) from happening or arising. Gun Culture: Behaviors, attitudes, and beliefs about firearms and their usage by individuals and communities.
