- Social Studies

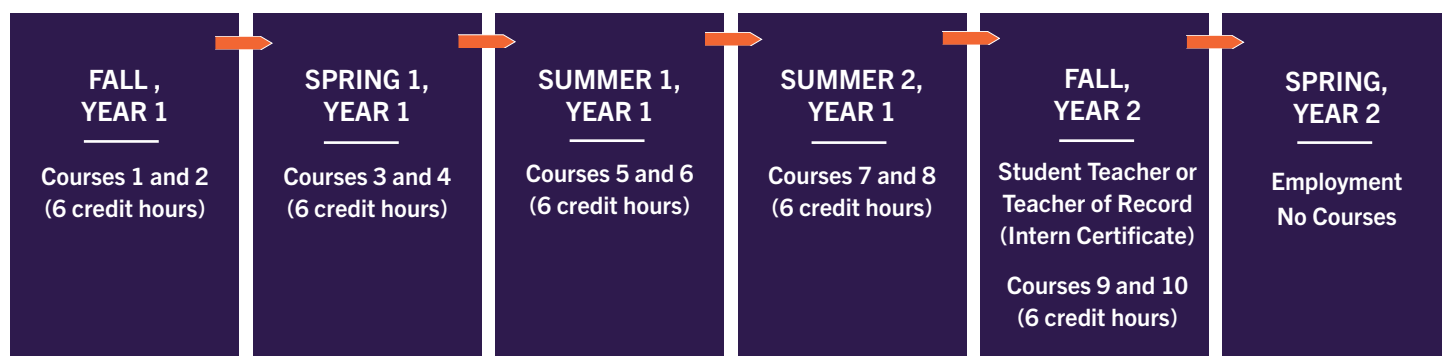
