Course Description: It is in Mathematics III that students pull together and apply the accumulation of learning that they have from their previous courses, with content grouped into four critical areas, organized into units. They apply methods from probability and statistics to draw inferences and conclusions from data. Students expand their repertoire of functions to include polynomial, rational, and radical functions. They expand their study of right triangle trigonometry to include general triangles. And, finally, students bring together all of their experience with functions and geometry to create models and solve contextual problems. The Mathematical Practice Standards apply throughout each course and, together with the content standards, prescribe that students experience mathematics as a coherent, useful, and logical subject that makes use of their ability to make sense of problem situations.

<u>Class Participation/ Notes</u>: Students are expected to take notes in class on a daily basis and will be expected to participate in class or group discussions/activities and demonstrate their work on the board. Students should be organized and keep up with all class materials and notes in their chromebook/ binder.

Homework: Students will receive homework daily in **Delta Math** or on google classroom. The purpose of homework is to measure student comprehension beyond the comfort of the classroom and teacher, as well as to give students more exposure to the subject area. Expect to have homework each night. It is an essential component for success in math.

Late work: not accepted unless special circumstances, email me if you have special circumstances!

Classwork: As assigned in class or on Delta Math

<u>Ouizzes</u>: There will be at least one scheduled Quiz during each unit. (30% of grade)

<u>Tests</u>: District made tests will be administered at the end of each unit. Study guides will be provided prior to every test. I will allow ample time for students to complete tests. There will be **NO extra time provided for students** who do not complete their test in the time allotted. There are no retakes or test corrections on tests for students. (50% of grade)

Final Exam: This course does have a mandatory state exam, which counts 20%, there are no exemptions.
