Essential Understandings	 Graphing linear equations and functions is a major skill necessary for Algebra I.
Essential Questions	 How do you plot points on a coordinate plane? How do you graph points using a table? What are intercepts of lines and how do you use them? What is slope? How do you graph using the slope-intercept form of an equation? What are functions?
Essential Knowledge	 The coordinate plane is made up of four quadrants. Intercepts of lines are where they cross each axis. Slope is rise divided by run. Slope-intercept form of an equation is y=mx + b. Functions are relations where each input gives exactly one output.
Vocabulary	 <u>Terms</u>: ordered pairs, linear equations, slope, x-intercept, y-intercept, slope intercept form, coordinate plane
Essential Skills	 Plot points in a coordinate plane. Graph points using a table. Find the intercepts of a line. Find slope of a line. Graph equations using the slope-intercept form. Identify whether relationships are functions or not.
