Welcome to Math in Nature

Math in Nature is a one-quarter (1/4 math credit) course designed for all students, those who enjoy math and those who don't enjoy math. We will be investigating how and where math appears in nature and how humans have used math to explore and explain natural phenomena. We will also spend time honing math skills for those who need it and/or learning more advanced mathematical concepts.

Course Description:

The goal of the course is to explore the many connections between mathematics and the natural world in which we live. Students will discover that mathematics is not just about numbers, problem solving and logic; math is about patterns, symmetry, structure, motion, and predictable order as well as chaos. Students will study topics such as the Fibonacci Sequence, the Golden Ratio, and fractals. We will look for patterns in flowers, pineapples, and seashells. We will collect data and look for pattern in things that grow and move and change and then develop and test mathematical models that describe the data. In addition, we will explore the fundamental question: Did humans <u>create</u> math or <u>discover</u> math? In exploring this, we will examine and recreate some early experiments done by ancient mathematicians. We will also explore the development of different number systems and methods for counting and keeping track of time.

This course will be project-based, with students working individually and in small groups on hands-on class work, projects, research projects, and presentations.
