## ~ A Message from the Fort Shaw Elementary Principal ~

Greetings Sun River Valley!

I hope this note finds you and your family healthy and safe. What a difficult and scary situation with COVID-19! My staff and I have appreciated all of your support and positive comments during the closure. We worked hard to provide the best learning opportunities we could while staying connected to our students. Teachers used Zoom to meet with students once a week, taught online using Seesaw, and provided instructional packets to all students. They did an awesome job! I'm very proud of my teachers!

I started a daily read aloud message and challenge on Facebook Live. That was a lot of fun! I read at 9:00 a.m. (or as close to it as possible) Monday-Thursday and "challenged" students each day. They could take part in the challenge if they wished and were entered to win prizes by completing the activities. I also gave a daily message to parents and students. I tried to mix things up to make it enjoyable and connect with kids. Students were able to make comments while I read since I did it live. That was a blast!

We also created a video message for our students! If you haven't seen it yet, please visit the Fort Shaw Elementary Facebook page or Twitter. It turned out great!

Our Library, Art, P.E., Music, and Counseling teachers sent some activities in the instructional packets but found a lot of great activities to post on Facebook and Twitter. We used social media to update information, links, daily read aloud/challenge, fun student pictures, videos, and resources.

Our 3rd Trimester grading system changed. When students are physically in attendance in their classrooms at the elementary level, their teachers traditionally assign grades as a standard practice in assessing learning using homework, participation, projects, and assessments. However, these were not normal times.

All elementary students were ONLY graded in the following areas: Reading, Language, and Mathematics. Rather than the traditional use of letter grades, all students received a G (Good), S (Satisfactory), or N (Needs Improvement) in these three core areas. Title 1 and Special Education progress reports have a similar format, but the language is a bit different. Even though the remaining subject areas were left ungraded, we still encouraged families and students to access additional learning opportunities through our remote learning platforms. These areas are equally important to the overall instructional program. Under the temporary grading system, teachers determined whether a student demonstrated proficiency in that subject area.

Students were assessed upon their completion, submission, and understanding of their work during the school closure. Students who completed their assignments and met expectations received either a G or S. If students did not complete their work, they received an N. Teachers continued to teach their curricula using Seesaw, Zoom, packets, and other avenues.

After careful consideration, we decided that this revision in our grading practices was the most appropriate course of action to support our students, parents, and staff during these challenging times.

Thank you for all you did to help your children be successful during this unprecedented time! Your unconditional support is much appreciated!

We love our Sun River Valley families! Stay healthy, follow precautions, and take care of one another. Together we will come out as strong as ever, and as always, ROAR On!
