MEADOWBROOK HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the 21 credits students need to graduate, the following is a short snippet of the graduation requirements for 9th – 12th graders at Meadowbrook High School.

TRADITIONAL PATHWAY

Students need to be competent with a score of 684 on the Algebra and

ELA 2 tests.

AND



Students need to earn at least 2 seals in order to graduate.

ALTERNATE PATHWAY

OR

Students must complete two of the following **At least one must be foundational**

FOUNDATIONAL

- Earn a score of proficient on three or more WebXams in a single career pathway
- Earn a 12-point approved industryrecognized credential
- Complete a pre-apprenticeship program

SUPPORTING

- Complete a 250-hour work-based learning experience.
- Earn the workforce readiness score on WorkKeys
- Earn the OhioMeansJobs-Readiness Seal.

SEALS

Students must earn two seals. At least one must be a state seal

- Ohio Means Jobs Readiness Seal: Must meet requirements and criteria established by the state.
- Industry-Recognized Credential Seal: Earn an approved credential in an in demand job.
- College-Ready Seal: Earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or SAT
- Military Enlistment Seal: Must provide evidence of enlistment in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces.
- Citizenship Seal: Earn a proficient score (700+) on the American History and Government EOC.
- Science Seal: Earn a proficient score (700+) on the biology EOC.
- Honors Diploma: Earn one of the six state-defined honors diplomas.
- Technology Seal: Earn a "B" or better in a CCP computer science course or complete a computer science course through our district.
- *Community Service Seal: Complete 40 hours of community service or log 120 work hours.
- *Fine and Performing Arts Seal: Complete four credits of fine arts or 2 credits of fine arts plus 2 pre-approved performances or 3 credits of fine arts plus 1 pre-approved performance. Minimum of 2 credits of fine arts at the high school or CCP equivalent.
- *Student Engagement Seal: Must participate in four seasons of athletics or four school clubs throughout high school (or a combination of both).
