NJSLA Testing Coming This Spring

This Spring, all Neptune Township schools will be administering the New Jersey Student Learning Assessment (NJSLA) in grades 3-9. Students in all grades will be testing in Mathematics and English Language Arts while 5th and 8th graders will also be taking the Science Assessment. Testing will take place between April 28th and May 30th with building specific testing dates released this March. Families can find information about the test, including parent guides, information on how to read score reports, and links to practice tests at https://nj.mypearsonsupport.com/ForParent/.

Teachers are working hard every day to make sure students are prepared to take the NJSLA. To help your children achieve their best score on the test:

- 1. Encourage your children to read every night.
- 2. Have your children talk to you about what they've read.
- 3. Talk to your children's teachers about what math skills they can practice at home.

Neptune Township School District Preschool Program Registration

The Neptune Township School District (NTSD) offers a free, 10-month, 6-hour daily preschool program for children who are 3 or 4 years old. To be eligible, children must have turned 3 or 4 years old on or before October 1st of the upcoming school year. This program is available exclusively to Neptune Township residents, and preschool placement is determined by the child's attendance zone (home school) and space availability. The preschool program is built around the Tools of the Mind curriculum, which addresses all aspects of early childhood learning and aligns with the New Jersey Preschool Teaching and Learning Standards. In NTSD preschool classes, children learn through play, and self-regulation development is both intentional and continuous.

Preschool registration for the 2025-2026 school year opens on March 17, 2025. For more information about the registration process and the high-quality preschool program, families are encouraged to attend an informational session on March 5, 2025, at 5:30 p.m. at Green Grove Elementary School. Following the session, there will be a "Learning Through Play" event from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the same location. Additionally, **Preschool and Kindergarten Classroom Tours**, as well as program information sessions, will take

place the week of March 10-14, 2025, from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the following locations:

- 3/10/2025 Shark River Hills Elementary School
- 3/11/2025 Gables Elementary School
- 3/12/2025 Summerfield Elementary School
- 3/13/2025 Green Grove Elementary School
- 3/14/2025 Midtown Community Elementary School

Program and registration information will be available at all events, and translators will be present for all school tours.
