Liberty Science Center to Present Chemistry Program for Elementary School Students

November 3, 2010, NEWARK, NJ—On Monday, November 8, 2010 at 9:00 a.m., eighth grade students from Newark's McKinley Elementary School will attend a chemistry assembly presented by Liberty Science Center. As part of their Traveling Science Program, the *Chemistry: What's your Reaction?* program will discuss the study of matter, its properties and the changes it undergoes. The visual program will show students how chemical reactions cause color changes, expanding bubbles and even shooting flames.

"The students are currently studying properties of matter, which includes physical and chemical properties. They are also studying the different states of matter, as well as learning about the metric system. Programs such as this one makes Science fun for our students and gives them an up close and personal chemistry experience," said Frank Verducci, Vice Principal of McKinley School.

The Newark Public Schools has formed numerous partnerships with companies and organizations to give more hands on learning experiences to students.
