

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM POLICY REGION 9 MEA-RETIRED

The MEA-R Scholarships are funded by revenue generated from the Wellness Program and the Parade of Homes.

Depending on funding available, scholarships will be awarded annually to recipient(s) who are dependents of MEA members in good standing or dependents of Region 9 MEA-Retired members and are graduating from a public school in the current school year. One scholarship will be designated the Al Rice Scholarship in memory of the founder of the Wellness program. Attempts will be made to diversify the geographic locations of recipients.

Scholarships are for standard academic college programs as well as trade or technology programs. The Al Rice Scholarship is intended for students who are seeking a degree in health or wellness.

Scholarships must be used at Michigan public colleges, universities, or public vocational training institutions which grant degrees, certifications, or licenses. Students attending Adrian College, Baker College-Flint, Owosso, Detroit College of Business, University of Detroit-Mercy, Finlandia University, and Ferris Kendall College of Art & Design will also be eligible with maintained affiliation with MEA. Other MEA affiliated colleges may be considered. Applicants at other, non-affiliated, private institutions are not eligible.

The chairperson of the Region 9 MEA-Retired Scholarship Committee will convene the Scholarship Committee for the purpose of reviewing applications and selecting the scholarship recipients.

- Scholarship recipients must be selected no later than April 15.
- The Chairperson will keep all completed application forms on file.
- At the May, general membership meeting the recipients will receive a congratulatory letter, an award certificate and a copy of the necessary enrollment verification. Each recipient will be allowed two guests to the luncheon.
- Scholarship checks will be written at the August Executive Board meeting.
- Checks will be made out to the recipient and the school. The memo line on the check will indicate the purpose of the check as "Tuition". The treasurer will give the checks to the Scholarship Chair for mailing.
- The Scholarship Chair will mail the checks to the school and notification to the student informing them that the check has been sent to the school.

REGION 9 MEA-RETIRED must be acknowledged on both the scholarship applications and the awards.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INFORMATION

The Region 9 MEA-Retired Chapter is offering a one-year scholarship for children of Michigan Education Association (MEA) members in good standing. Applicants must be graduating from a public high school in 2019. The following information details the necessary criteria and requirements to apply.

- Minimum of a 2.0 grade point average during the applicant's junior and senior years.
- Students must be attending and graduating from a Region 9 public school (Ionia, Kent, Montcalm, Ottawa counties).
- Parent(s) or guardian (or grandparents) must be a Michigan Education Association (MEA) member in good standing.

Students must plan to attend a Michigan public college or university. Students who are considering one of the following schools: Adrian College; Baker College – Flint, Owosso; Detroit College of Business; University of Detroit-Mercy; Finlandia University; and Ferris State University-Kendall College of Art & Design are also eligible. School eligibility is based on their affiliation with MEA. Attendees at other private institutions and /or church colleges are not eligible.

Additional information required:

- Activities:
 - Scholastic Awards i.e. Honor Society
 - School Activities i.e. sports, clubs, student leadership etc.
 - Extra-curricular activities i.e. Scouts, church groups, tutoring etc.
- Work and/or volunteer experience
- A 200 – 300 Word essay addressing the following question: How might furthering your education contribute to your life; the lives of others; and contribute to reaching your goals?
- Letters of recommendation from one educator and one non-school related person
