ontgomery High School is a premier, state of the art learning institution with a dual focus on academic achievement and social-emotional character development for all students. Montgomery High School is located in Central New Jersey, four miles north of Princeton and serves the suburban communities of Montgomery, Skillman, Belle Mead, Blawenburg, Rocky Hill and parts of Princeton. These communities reflect a tradition of support for academic and cultural achievement. Montgomery High School offers an extremely challenging scholastic environment and consistently produces many of New Jersey's highest achieving learners. Each graduating class over the past decade has sent at least 91% of graduates on to four-year colleges. The Program of Studies offers 21 Advanced Placement courses, 19 Honors and accelerated courses as well as a wide array of challenging academic electives.

#### **Class Rank**

The academic environment at Montgomery High School is very challenging. The majority of our students meet that challenge by earning exemplary grades. We believe that our students' levels of achievement are not equitably or fully communicated by class rank. Accordingly, Montgomery High School does not report class rank.

#### **Grading**

Montgomery High School teachers believe in teaching beyond the test and most subscribe to stringent grading procedures. Therefore marking period grades may not necessarily correlate with standardized test results.

#### G.P.A.

Both weighted and unweighted grade point averages are calculated. The cumulative GPA is weighted with five additional points added to each Honors level and Advanced Placement course final grade. Only the cumulative semester GPA incorporates these weightings. The final course grade posted on the transcript is the actual grade earned in the course.

## A TRADITION OF ACHIEVEMENT

#### **CURRICULUM**

The Class of 2011 must successfully complete 125 credits, 5 credits more than the New Jersey State graduation requirement of 120 credits. Students are required to complete 4 units of English, 3 units of Mathematics, 3 units of Laboratory Science, 3 units of Social Studies, 1 unit of World Language, 4 units of Health/Physical Education, 1 unit of Visual or Performing Arts, and 1 unit of Practical Art / Career Exploration. All Montgomery High School students are required to schedule a minimum of 35 credits per year in grades 9 - 11 and a minimum of 30 credits in grade 12.
