Final Exam Schedule and Information

I. Overview – MHS Final Examination Period

June 12- Full day of school: Students will attend all 8 classes A1-B4 June 13 and 18 (W, M) Full Days of School

- 1. School-wide review for Final Examinations
- 2. June 13th will be an "A Day" and June 18th a "B Day."

June 14, 15, 19 and 20 (TR, F, T, W) Early Dismissal

- 1. Two exams per day
- 2. Testing periods will be 120 minutes in length.
- 3. Student day will begin with their first exam at 7:20 A.M. each day followed by a 30 minute break (snacks available for purchase in cafeteria), and then the second exam at 9:50 A.M.
- 4. Final Examination grades reflect 12% of the final grade for the course.

Highlights of Other Senior Class Culminating Activities

Senior Dinner Dance, June 8, will be held at St. Mary's Hall on Brooks Blvd. in Hillsborough from 6:30 to 10:30 P.M. Students must dress appropriately (semi-formal attire: **boys must wear a tie**).

Final Exams, June 14, 15, 19, and 20, will take place each day beginning at 7:20 A.M. There will be two exams administered per day.

Distribution of caps and gowns, June 20, will take place both between and after the final exam periods.

The Senior Breakfast, June 21, will take place outside, under the science wing at 7:20 A.M. prior to graduation practice. Parents of seniors conduct this activity, which is funded by the senior class.

Graduation Practice, June 21, is **mandatory** for those students choosing to be part of the commencement ceremony. **Graduates must arrive for practice on time and remain until the practice has concluded.** Dismissal time depends on the amount of time required to satisfactorily prepare for the graduation program. It will conclude no later than 2:30 P.M.

On June 21st, the Graduation Ceremony for the Class of 2018 will begin promptly at 6:00 P.M. Weather permitting, the ceremony will take place at Cougar Stadium. Each graduate will receive a total of six tickets. Four of these tickets may be used for outside or indoor seating (in the gymnasium in the event of inclement weather). The other two tickets may be used for outdoor seating, or in the event of inclement weather, in the Montgomery Performing Arts Center to view the ceremony on closed circuit television. Graduates will assemble in the gymnasium at 5:15 P.M. Participation in the graduation ceremony is voluntary. Any student may choose not to participate in the commencement exercise. Anyone who does not comply with the "Dress Code for Graduation" or displays inappropriate conduct will be removed from the ceremony. Remember, participating in graduation is a privilege, not a right.

Class of 2018 Graduation Ceremony Dress Code

- 1. Girls must wear a dress, skirt or dress pants and a blouse under their gown.
- 2. Boys must wear dress pants.
- 3. Boys must wear dress shoes and a dress shirt with a tie.
- 4. Jeans or shorts are not permitted.
- 5. Flip-flops and sneakers are not acceptable.

The graduation ceremony normally runs approximately 2.5 hours. Montgomery graduates and parents will be able to purchase graduation ceremony pictures. Graduation pictures will be of the individual student receiving their diploma and will be taken by Milan Rose. Order forms have been sent home electronically by Mr. Pachuta. Hard copies are available in the main office and on the MHS website. Payment and order envelope must be received prior to graduation. Candids will be available for purchase online through Milan Rose.
