Quiz Create a 15 question quiz for the book/story. Remember to include the answer key. No more than 5 questions should be multiple choice. All questions should demonstrate a deep understanding of the text. Remember to integrate cited text evidence!	Video/Vlog Create a video or script in which you reflect on the book you read. Your video must at least include a reflection, review, of the book, and a brief biography of the author. Remember to integrate cited text evidence!
