6-8th Grade

Objective: Students will use the elements of art and principles of design to create work inspired by graffiti.

Materials:* White paper Colored Pencils Colored Markers (sharpie, washable, etc) Pencil Ruler

*modified for at-home: anything on hand!

Steps:

- 1) Sketch design in sketchbook, keeping design and composition in mind (see lettering examples).
- 2) Transfer final sketch to white paper. Make sure the name is centered, takes up an appropriate amount of space, and is neat.
- 3) Draw a "brick wall" behind your design (see example on slide show).
- 4) Using a chosen color scheme, color the foreground (name) with markers.
- 5) Color the background (bricks) with colored pencils (see example and how-to on slide show).
- 6) Trace foreground outline with a black marker to add emphasis to the work.
- 7) Clean lines and edit.
