





What Do You Need to Know About High School?

- Feeling nervous is normal
- High School offers many opportunities
- Everything <u>counts</u> from Day One
- High School is <u>safe</u>, fun and exciting
- High School is where you begin to define who you are and what you want

- Be prepared for change and be willing to step out of your "Comfort Zone"

Myths & Truths About High School

Myths

- I have to take Art or Music in Grade 9
- I'm not going to earn enough credits to graduate
- Lunch for all 9th graders is period 6 or 7 and I <u>have</u> to build my entire schedule around lunch

Truths

- You are required to take one year of Art or Music before you graduate
- You need 22 credits; the average earned is 28!
- Lunch is available periods 4-8. Your lunch period might have to change in the spring semester to take an elective you want! "Oh No!"

4+1 Option Pathway to Graduation:
