Green Ribbon Award Highlights

Pillar I: Reduced Environmental Impact and Costs

- 64.7% reduction in energy use.
- 100% of the school's purchased energy comes from renewable wind energy.
- 33% reduction of domestic water use.
- 100% reduction of irrigation.
- Rain barrels were built by students and installed to supply the gardens with irrigation.
- Renewable energy is generated onsite through solar panels.
- Day lighting controls and occupancy sensors reduce wasted electricity.
- Sunscreens assist with passive solar heating and cooling
- Two electric vehicle charging stations are located in the visitor parking lot.

Pillar II: Improved Health and Wellness for Staff and Students

- Indoor air quality is greatly improved through the use of under floor air distribution (air displacement) that introduces the air at the occupant level.
- The students received 30 minutes of physical education each week with a certified PE teacher plus an additional 120 minutes each week of classroom teacher directed PE.
- Each year, Midtown Community students participate in the American Heart Association's "Jump Rope for Heart" program.
- Staff members are encouraged to participate in the "Neptune Meltdown", a district wide initiative to promote healthy life choices through a Biggest Loser-style weight loss competition.

Pillar III: Effective Environmental and Sustainability Education

- Kindergarten through 5th grade students participate in the SummerWood Environmental Science Program. This includes two trips a year through SummerWood.
- Kindergarten through 3rd grade students plant perennial gardens on campus to attract and support local species of birds and butterflies.
- 4th and 5th grade students plant vegetable gardens and finish the year with a salad party to celebrate their harvest.
- The rooftop garden will be used to grow indigenous species that will be transplanted to rebuild the Ocean Grove dunes and reestablish native species in Summer Wood.
- The 5th grade students participate in the district's Environmental Marine Science Program. The classes take a field trip to Sandy Hook to study the plants and animals that live in the marine environments.
