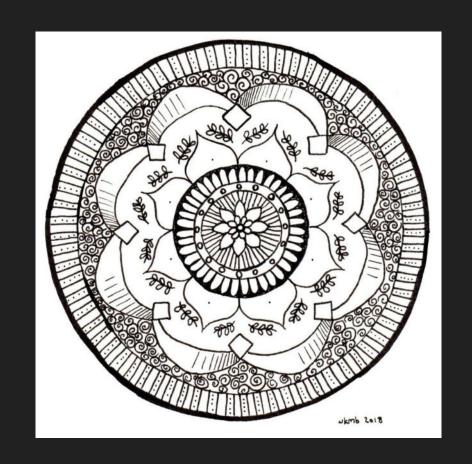

What is Mindfulness?

What is Mindfulness?

- Type of meditation in which you focus on being aware of what you're sensing and feeling in the moment.
- Involves breathing methods and guided imagery to relax the body and mind and help reduce stress.
- Mindful drawing is when you bring yourself (mind and body) to the present moment and get immersed in the act of drawing without doing anything else simultaneously.

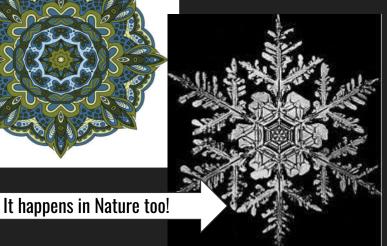


Symmetry and Radial Symmetry in Art

Symmetry - when one side of an artwork reflects the other side. Radial symmetry - when a regularly arranged artwork radiates from a central point.

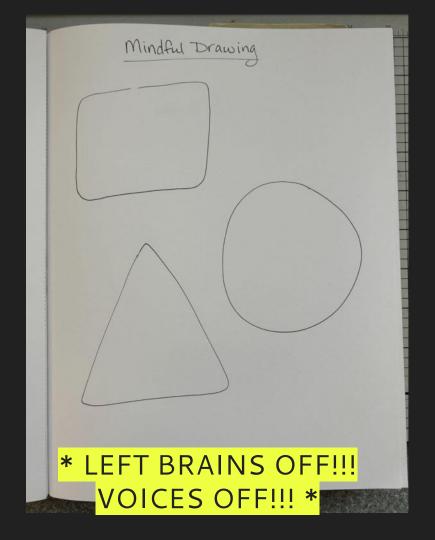






Steps:

- Open to a fresh page in the FRONT half of your Sketchbook.
- 2. Draw three different shapes on this page. Your 3 shapes should almost fill the page.
- 3. Watch and listen to the Kaleidoscope video for a few minutes, begin an automatic, doodle drawing in one of these shapes.
- 4. Watch the video when you need a break or have lost your creativity.
- 5. After you finish filling one shape, move to the next. These drawings should take several minutes each.

Demonstrate knowledge of color schemes.

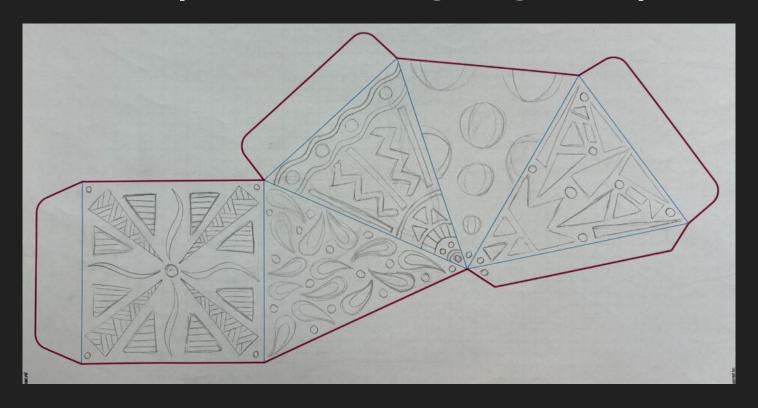
Practice colored pencil drawing skills.

Focus on lines, shapes and abstract symmetrical designs.

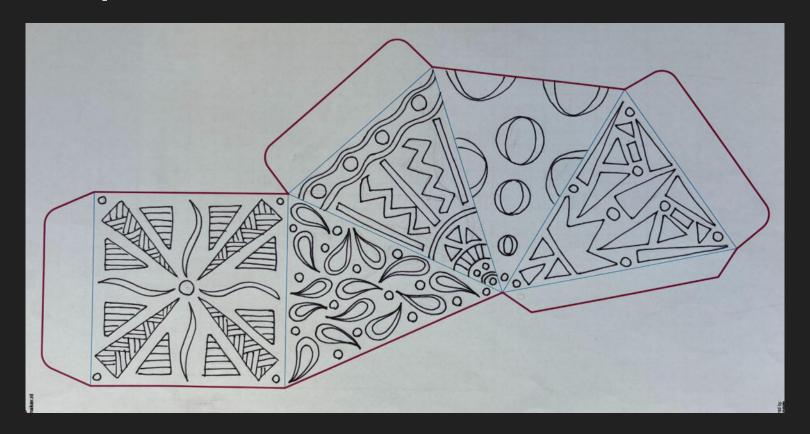
Create a 3D form that includes all FIVE of the color schemes we have learned.

Ink over pencil lines...

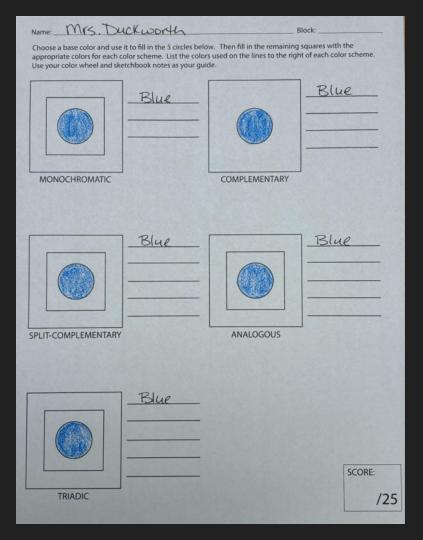

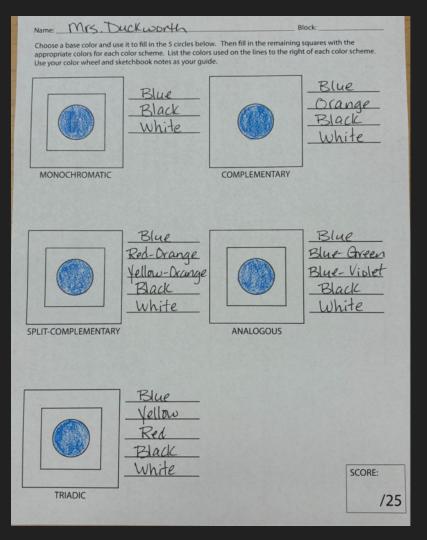
Pick a base color...

List the colors...

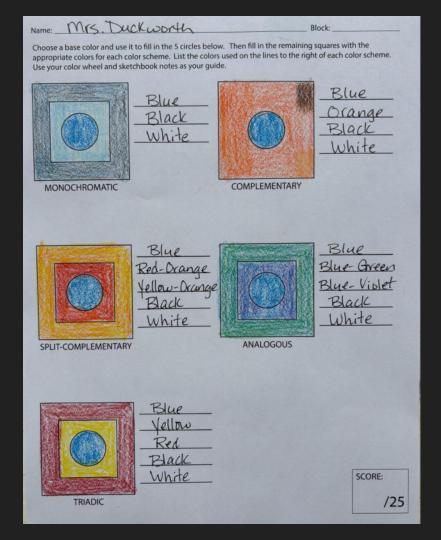
Using your starting base color, write the names of the colors for each color scheme on the lines provided.

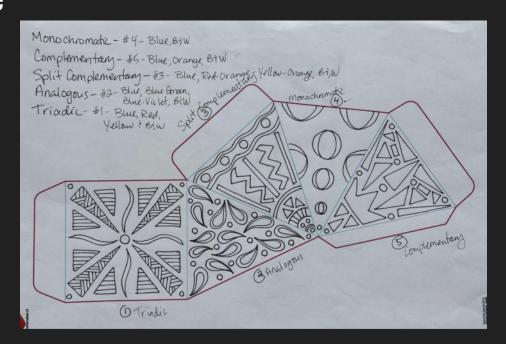


Plan where each color scheme will be on your form...

 if you have more than 5 sides on your form, you can use any color scheme

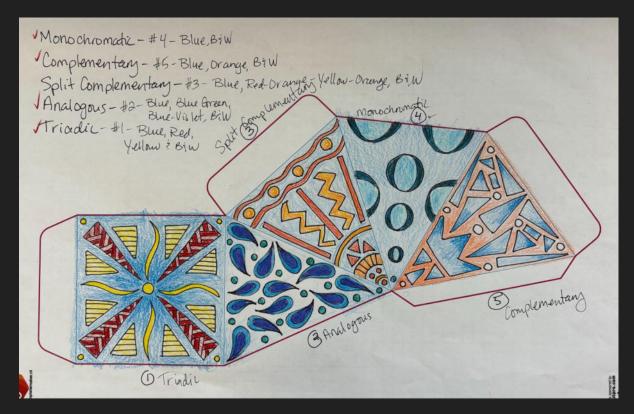
Label your drawing and write the color schemes you're using for each side on your paper.
