Miner Broadcasting Receives State and National Recognition



Students in the Digital Writing class at Negaunee High School have recently been recognized for excellence in broadcasting. Miner Broadcasting produces Live and On Demand broadcasts of NHS sports, as well as Negaunee Public Schools concerts and other events.

Earlier this spring, students in the Program received multiple awards from the Michigan High School Athletic Association as part of their annual Excellence Awards for the Student Broadcast Program. NHS received awards for excellence in Use of Graphics and Overall Production Quality. The Program received the second most awards statewide and was one of only two schools to receive a first place award. Ours was for Best Highlight.

This fall, Negaunee High School was recognized as a "Select School" for 2017-18 by the NFHS Network. Of the over 1700 schools that participate in the NFHS Broadcast Program across the country, 50 schools received "Elite" status, while 100 schools were named "Select".

In announcing this recognition, the NFHS Network stated: "Elite and Select schools demonstrate professional, excellent broadcasting skills while covering sports and events at their schools. These Elite and Select schools distinguished themselves as leaders among the 1,700+ schools involved in the School Broadcast Program. The NFHS Network is proud to congratulate them for their continued dedication and contributions to the Network."
