MICROSOFT OFFICE SPECIALIST CERTIFICATION ACHIEVED

Negaunee High School computer students are honing their office skills. Students in Mrs. Holmgren's computer courses are taking part in Microsoft IT Academy program, made available through a partnership between Microsoft, Certiport and the State of Michigan. Grant money from the State has been appropriated through the 2016-17 school year for schools that wish to participate.

The program offers **free** access to:

- Microsoft Office Training and Curriculum
- 50 **free** Microsoft Office Professional Licenses for school use
- 500 free certification licenses (Normally \$100 each)
- 30 free certification exams for teachers

This program helps students develop relevant work skills and offers students a chance to certify for free-subsidizing the normal \$100 fee. Certification demonstrates proficiency in the use of Microsoft Office. Our computer students have shown great effort in hopes of earning industry-recognized certification, which will be useful in the workforce. The exams are challenging but more than 20 students have earned their certifications so far. Sixth and seventh grade students at Negaunee Middle School recently competed in the National Geographic GeoBee. During the preliminary rounds, students were asked questions from a variety of categories such as: United States Geography, Weird, But True and World Comparisons.

Sixteen students made it to the Championship Round, where after another four grueling rounds of questions, Andrew Feys was crowned the 2015 GeoBee champion for Negaunee Middle School and Josie Thomson, first runner-up. Andrew will advance to the next level of competition, a qualifying test to determine state competitors. If he qualifies, Andrew would be able to compete in the national championship to be held in Washington, D.C. in May.

The Digital Writing class at NHS was recently awarded \$1500 in new professional audio equipment by the Detroit Sports Broadcasters Association. The grant, submitted by Digital Writing teacher Andy Skewis, was one of three awarded across the state. The equipment will be used to improve and expand the quality of broadcasts that the students in the class produce. The class, in its second year, has produced over 100 events that are broadcast live and on demand over the internet. Their coverage includes Negaunee Miners athletics as well as concerts and other events. The program is part of the National Federation of High Schools Networks and MHSAA TV.

Digital Writing students write and produce original work about students, staff, organizations and events in the Negaunee Public Schools, as well as other creative works. Their monthly feature, "Maize & Blue" can also be seen on demand through their website.
