






Core Values and Drivers

Connect, Collaborate, and Grow

Academies

- An umbrella of instructional/programmatic themes
 - Global Studies (9), AC STEM (9-12), Visual, Performing, and Applied Arts (9-12), Business and Government (9-12), and Education, Liberal Arts, and Human Services (9-12)

Pathways

- Customized to meet Virginia Department of Education graduation requirements.
- College and career pathways are customized course sequences based on student's passion and interest areas that are flexible and adaptable to student needs.

Small Learning Communities

- Defines the student's four-year experience.
- Teachers connect with a subgroup of students to ensure interdisciplinary alignment to the Pathways and offer advisement and mentorship.













SY 24-25 ACPS Program of Studies

What is the ACPS Program of Studies (POS)?

- Written for students and parents to outline general and specific information regarding ACPS course offerings.
- The POS is developed each year.

Program of Studies Organization

- Existing courses have been organized into pathways that lead to students meeting their graduation requirements.
- There is no change in curriculum.
- Organizing courses in academies and pathways is a progressive step that many of our neighboring school divisions have been implementing for a number of years now.


