MEETING AGENDA

9:30 - 9:40 am: Welcome

Dan Leffingwell gave a brief welcome and talked about the purpose of the work that is being done through the ECOESC Business Advisory Committee.

9:40 - 10:05 am: Business Advisory Council County Meeting Updates *Keri Rosser addressed the group by explaining that the BAC held three different County Workforce Collaborative meetings in Guernsey, Belmont, and Tuscarawas counties last fall. While the industries may vary in the different counties, the barriers are very similar. Transportation, professional/soft skills, and motivation seem to be the top three barriers. Student programming has been collected in Guernsey as "live" data because the Career Navigators were able to collect the information. Keri expressed that it would be nice to have this data from the other counties and asked the group for assistance in the future. Jason Bunting from Cambridge High School also added that while they are trying to expose students to options by getting them out of the building, giving teachers*

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the opportunity to see what businesses are in the community and what opportunities are available to students is also a goal of theirs.

10:05 - 10:20 am: BAC Goals & Achievements

Keri Rosser & Jeremy Vittek went over the goals that the ECOESC Business Advisory Council stated in the plan for this year.

1. Develop Professional Skills for Future Careers

Mark Cook & Jeremy Vittek will be trained this summer to offer Leadership Excellence to students. This will primarily be offered to CCMEP students in Belmont County because of the grant that these two individuals are under. This training is a 3 point industry recognized credential that is approved by ODE in every industry.

Pre-Apprenticeship Workshops were offered in the month of January for all schools that are participating in that program. Jeremy asked if there were other training sessions that the group was hoping to see from the ESC. Lean Six Sigma training did come up and the ESC will look into funding options and vendors.

2. Build Partnerships

Keri explained that the ESC offers a Career Connections program for 7th and 8th grade students. In Tuscarawas county, it is offered to both grades. In Guernsey, it is offered to only 8th grade students at this time. We are in the process of looking into options to expand into Belmont County in the future.

3. Coordinate Experiences

The goal for this area is to create some sort of a central calendar that schools can see what is happening in the different counties to coordinate events. There is also a goal to put together

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one page handouts on the different pathways for in-demand jobs in our area as well. Keri and Jeremy explained that this goal is one that we have not concentrated on as of yet. However, work will begin in this area soon.

There was some discussion in the room regarding these goals. It was mentioned that it would be beneficial to have data on young adults to see what they are interested in and then where they actually end up. ODE has put in place that schools must provide follow-up information on all students so we should be able to see some of this data soon. The Cambridge YMCA expressed an interest to work with students in any pathway.

The Lt. Governor's Office shared that there are Internships in Information Technology available. Companies are able to be reimbursed 75% of the wages of students who work 120 hours and 100% of the wages for students that work 200 hours.

The group was asked whether or not they used the OhioMeansJobs website to post positions. Only one business in the room utilizes the website. The feedback from the group on Zoom was that they had not had much luck with the website. In Guernsey County, the OMJ Office posts a lot of jobs on the website on behalf of the local businesses.

10:20 - 10:50 am: YouScience Presentation - Andrea Smith, North Point ESC Dan Leffingwell stated that this was a good segway into the YouScience discussion and introduced Andrea Smith. Andrea Smith explained that North Point ESC covers 4 counties (42 school districts). They provided Teacher/Business Boot Camps. These run for one week in the summer. Teachers are provided with graduate credits. During the week, teachers visit six different businesses. This is a program that could easily be shared/duplicated with our ESC.



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Andrea also presented on YouScience and how NPESC uses the product. This program allows students to be exposed to more careers. The difference in YouScience and other options is the aptitude assessments. While the interest inventories are great, students cannot show interest in areas they do not know. Therefore, interests can change. Aptitudes do not change after the age of 14-15 because that is when it solidifies. The program brings both interests and aptitudes together.

There is also a place for businesses to interact to see the potential pipeline of workers. Some businesses are even sending out recruiting letters to students based off of the data in the program.

Economic Development organizations could use the information to forecast the potential workforce as well. Higher Education could use it to build programs.

10:50 - 11:15 am: Questions/Discussion

During the Q&A, Dan explained that he had a quote for the schools in our area for the program. ECOESC is looking for different ways to get this program paid for but it is important that teachers buy into it as well. Caldwell Schools stated that they just purchased this. They were very impressed with the data they are seeing but having teacher buy-in helped when students began to get frustrated during the assessments.

Dan stated that he would send out more information and set up a follow-up call with YouScience for the schools that were interested.
