


Born April 20th 1893, in Barcelona, Spain.


Died December 25th, 1983 in Palma Spain.

His early work was somewhat realistic, and greatly inspired by popular artists of that time period (Paul Cezanne)








Eventually Miro developed his own style that fit into the Surrealist movement. Although most Surrealists created realistic dream like images he created abstract images.

Miro famously declared that he wished to "Assassinate painting".


He was fired of the way an authentic art style would be taken over and similar styles would be used to further political agendas.


























This sculpture can be found in Chicago across the street from a famous Picasso sculpture.
