MLA Citation form: Quick Look for a Bibliography, or Works Cited page

Book

Author's Last Name, First Name, Middle Name. *Title of Book*. Publisher's Name, Year of Publication. Example:

- 1) Burg, Ann E. Serafina's Promise. Scholastic, Inc., 2013.
- **Electronic resources*** (featuring magazine and newspaper articles, and encyclopedia entries) *citations are included in nearly all e-resources on our Library webpage. This allows appropriate copy and paste into a Works Cited page, which is ordered by last names of authors (and title of articles if no author designated)

Author's Last Name, First Name, Middle Name (if available). "Article Title." Name of Magazine. Date of Publication: Page Numbers. Name of Database. Web. Date You Viewed It.

Examples with and without author:

- 1) "Record-breaking rain drowns highways in Phoenix area." UPI NewsTrack. 8 Sept. 2014. Kids InfoBits. Web. 11 Sept. 2014.
- 2) Thompson, Sharon. "Save the Chiru. (News)." National Geographic Kids Apr. 2003: 8. Kids InfoBits. Web. 11 Sept. 2014

Author's Last Name, First Name Middle Name (if available). "Article Title." Title of Encyclopedia. Edition editor. Year of Publication. Web OR Print. Date You Viewed It.

Examples with and without author:

- 1) "Coast Guard, United States." World Book Student. World Book, 2013. Web. 12 Dec. 2013.
- 2) Deshpande, C. D. "India." Reviewed by Donald Johnson. *Grolier Multimedia Encyclopedia*. Grolier Online, 2014. Web. 11 Sept. 2014.
- **Web site** found on the internet, often beginning with www, which is the URL Uniform Resource Locator Author Last Name, First Name Middle Name. "Specific Page or Article Title." Name of Web Site. Publisher, Date of Publication. Web. Date You Viewed It. <URL>.
