Left indent of 1 inch for indented paragraphs. Whatever your present plans for employment or further education, you should consider your long-term career goals. You might wonder why someone who is considering a first job should be thinking beyond that job.

Thinking ahead may help you choose a first job that is closely related to long-term interests. . . . With a career goal in mind, you can evaluate beginning job offers in relation to that goal. (Oliverio, Pasewark, and White 528)

Another useful step in career planning is to develop a personal profile of your skills, interests, and values.
