- 1. More than **70** % of your body is water.
- 2. **70%** of the earth's surface is covered with water. About **2.5** % of water on earth is fresh. 1 1/2 % of this is held in polar glaciers, leaving only **1** % of water on earth available for drinking.
- 3. **25** % of all bottled water sold in the United States is just tap water.
- 4. The springhouse keeps contaminates from getting into the spring.
- 5. The pump house has a holding tank in it with a capacity of **500** gallons.
- 6. There is a **14,000** gallon tank at the production facility.
- 7. Ozone (unstable form of oxygen) is used to purify the spring water for bottling.
- 8. At Iceland Springs, the lava rock in the ground acts as a natural filter.
- 9. Sacramento municipal water is used for bottled water because of all the minerals in it. **Sand** and **charcoal** filters are used to start the purification process.
- 10. Animal bladders and gourds were used to carry water in earlier times.
- 11. The city of **Venice** used sand filters to purify water.
- 12. In Europe during the Middle Ages, it was unfashionable to drink water because it was dirty
- 13. The wealthy drank small beer (beer with an alcohol content just high enough to kill pathogens).
- 14. Europeans finally found clean fresh water in the 18th and 19th centuries in the Pristine Springs.
- 15. In 1913, engineers discovered how to disinfect water for drinking.
- 16. Water is a \$10 billion industry today.
- 17. Water expands about 9 % as it freezes.
- 18. Glacial acetic acid sinks when frozen.
- 19. The H₂0 molecule looks kind of like Mickey Mouse ears.
- 20. Surface tension allows the water bug to walk on water.
- 21. Almost everything except oil dissolves in water.
- 22.1 in 6,600 of water molecules is called heavy water because it has hydrogen that are heavier than normal.
- 23. Bruce Power puts about 2000 tons of water into Lake Huron. About 2 oz of this is heavy water.

- 24. Sound moves much slower in water than in air. The speed of sound in the air is 4500 ft/sec
- 25. There is about 50 million acres of farmland in the United States.
- 26. The aquifer contains about a quadrillion (1,000,000,000,000,000) gallons of water.
- 27. Center pivots used for crop irrigation move in a **clockwise** direction.
- 28. To water the 130 acres, it takes about 3 days.
- 29.60% of the irrigated cropland in the United States is irrigated with gravity irrigation.
- 30. Mesopotamia, the site of present day Iraq, first invented gravity irrigation.
- 31. Farmers in the early 1900s got their water from the aquifers by the use of windmills.
- 32. In 1931, the American Dust Bowl started and lasted until 1939.
- 33. In 1952, the first center pivot watering system was patented.
- 34. About 5 trillion gallons of water is removed from the aquifer each year.
- 35. One acre of corn releases about 4,000 gallons of water into the air through transpiration each day.
- 36. The fountain at the Bellagio Hotel and Casino covers about 8 acres.
- 37. The smallest sprinkler head in the fountain is called the nano-shooters.
- 38. The mini shooter can shoot water about 150 feet into the air.
- 39. The super shooter can shoot water **250 feet** high.
- 40. The underwater robots that control the sprinklers are called **oarsmen**.
- 41. At any given time, the fountains at the Bellagio can shoot 17,000 gallons of water into the air.
- 42. On July 7, 2003 (date) the Opportunity went to Mars.
- 43. The Martian poles have been found to contain frozen water.
- 44. There is evidence of a habitat environment on Mars.
- 45. In 2006, Saturn's moon produced 260 mile vapor plumes.
- 46. Water is the most important treasure we have on this plant and is vital for all life on earth.
