Monochromatic Painting

- 1. Draw 1 still-life object on construction paper. Use construction paper draw out the shape of the object. Use strong solid lines not sketchy lines. (Remember: a contour line is a line that represents an outline of the subject/object).
- 2. Think about the proportions: the comparison of elements one to another in terms of size.
- 3. Cut out the shape
- 4. On 12 x 18 white paper, repeatedly trace the shape following the criteria below.

Criteria

- a. Shapes must overlap
- b. Shapes must stay the same, DO NOT change shape
- c. Shapes must run off the page
- d. Shapes must balance the positive and negative space
- 5. Pick one light source for your painting. From the top, bottom, left or right side.
- 6. Pick one color and use the tints and shades of that hue to create a monochromatic painting.
- 7. Make sure you are working on blending colors and a strong monochromatic scale. Do not jump from a light color to a dark color to quickly.
