Looking for Value: Create in Monochromatic

Learning Goals: FP 6.1.2) Student will be able to demonstrate a basic understanding of elements and principles of design in photography.

Overview & Directions: Value is one of the elements of art and design. It is used in all types of art. For this challenge your mission is to create a monochromatic photo series showcasing a range of your use of value.

Value refers to the lightness and darkness of a surface. There are times a photographer might want to use high contrast images, but for this project your mission is to show a wide array of value. Get as many different values of the color you choose as possible. Can you get at least 10 different values of the color?

For editing I recommend not using the tools on your camera so you have better control of the values on your images. Use Photoshop, Lightroom, or a different app to convert your images.

Monochromatic is a color scheme based on only one, single color as well as using only it's variations (tints, tones, and shades). You can also alter the saturation and brightness of the base color.
