Moon station 6

Use the materials provided to paint a realistic depiction of the moon.

Include the following features:

- Apennine Mountains
- Copernicus Crater
- Mare Serenitatis
- Tycho Crater
- Plato Crater



Procedure:

- 1. Write your group name on the back of the paper. Use the plate provided as your "painters plate".
- 2. Paint the background first.
- 3. The background should have a lighter blue color in the middle.
- 4. The blue color should get progressively darker as it goes toward the edges of the paper. How could you do this?
- 5. Allow the background to dry. This is a great time to research each of the features that you must include in your painting (What do they look like? Where are they located?)
- 6. When the background is dry, begin painting the moon.
- 7. Paint a white circle. This will be the base layer for your moon.
- 8. Mix black and white paint to make various shades of grey.
- 9. Use these shades to paint the topography of the moon (don't forget to include the features listed above!)
- 10. Clean up! Make sure to clean up your mess and wash out your paint brushes for the next group.
