How will I check my grade in class?

Every Friday, Mrs. Crytzer will offer the students a grade-check. Additionally, parents and students are also strongly encouraged to check <u>Vision SIS</u> on a weekly basis to view the most current grades for EVERY class.

What do I do if I am absent?

Always check **Google Classroom** or **Vision SIS** site for agendas, handouts, and assignment due dates. A student has two extra days to turn in any work **assigned** on a day a student was absent. If a quiz was administered on a day a student was absent, the quiz must be made up on the **first** day the student returns. If previously assigned work was due on the day of the absence, the work is due on the **first** day the student returns otherwise it is considered late.

Do I have to read outside of class?
