Choir - Spring Season Update from Mr. Schreiber

It was a fantastic year for the Whiteford choirs at MSVMA District 12 Solo & Ensemble and Choral Festival this year!

On February 12th the Men's Ensemble and Women's Ensemble performed at the MSVMA District 12 Solo & Ensemble Festival at Dundee HS and each received a DIVISION I rating of EXCELLENT. In addition to soloists Olivia Cossins and Rylyn Wing also earned DIVISION I ratings of EXCELLENT...Olivia with a perfect performance score!

All events advanced to the MSVMA State Solo & Ensemble Festival and their performances were last Saturday, March 19th, in the midst of the musical. Everyone earned DIVISION I ratings of EXCELLENT. Olivia Cossins earned another perfect score in her solo performance and Rylyn Wing earned a perfect score in sight reading at the Intermediate level!

The HS Chorale (Ensemble) performed at the MSVMA District 12 Choral Festival on Friday, March 4th at Monroe HS and received a solid DIVISION I rating of EXCELLENT in performance and sightreading.

The MS Concert Choir performed on Tuesday, March 8th, at Clarenceville HS and also received a DIVISION I rating of EXCELLENT in performance and sightreading, with a perfect score in sight reading!

The HS Concert Choir performed on Wednesday, March 9th, at Clarenceville HS and received a DIVISION I rating in performance and sightreading, keeping in mind 10 singers out of 32 were on the DC trip or at the FFA state conference or out due to other conflicts.

The HS Choirs will attend the MSVMA State Choral Festival at Rochester HS on April 26, 2022.

The MS Choir will attend the MSVMA State Choral festival at the Detroit School for the Arts on May 5, 2022.

Economics “Food Truck” Project-Based Learning

Students in Mr. Simmons’ Economics class applied what they have learned in the 3rd marking period through the creation of a food truck or coffee house project. Students used their understanding and learning around opportunity and sunk costs, franchising, law of demand and supply, the law of diminishing return, capital, cost benefit analysis as well as numerous others that were then applied to the food truck or coffee house they created and developed. Students were also able to encompass first semester learning from civics (capitalism, socialism, and communism) and apply it to how government can be involved with their business. Overall, the students produced some great food and coffee, while some of these kids created something that could be sold “in the real world.”
