Course Description

This <u>behind the scenes</u> course facilitates the technical applications of professional Television production methods to include: Scriptwriting, Camera operation, Lighting set-up, Audio production and Editing using high-end editing software such as: Final Cut Pro, Adobe Premiere and I Movies. This course is geared for the technically savvy student interested in pursuing the many exciting careers in Television Production.

Pre-production phase.

Introduction of Television Production jobs, Vocabulary, Scripting, Editing software (Music, Graphics and Editing) and TV field Equipment.

Completion of individual scripts is mandatory.

<u>Producing duties will include</u>: Determination of talent needs, location scouting, location taping, narration recording, music selection, special effects creation and editing. Shooting of all scenes with teammates determined by script.

<u>Post – Production -</u> Groups finalize all shooting, create "Rough Cut" of show, lay down narration, recording music, create graphics, finalize editing program.

Complex editing techniques must be featured in the programs to include narration, graphics creation, musical enhancements, animations, sound effects, special effects and fast-paced editing sequences
- -Mid-Term & Final Exam True & False, Fill-in-the-blank- & Essay exams based on exercises, classroom handouts and discussions.
