The Final Big Deal Project

90s MUSIC VIDEO!

Working in a group of three or four, select a song from the 90s and TELL A STORY (Narrative). The *song* itself doesn't have to tell a story, but you'll need to create one that fits the music.

- The video must be at least 3:00. If your song is shorter, the storyline should begin before music.
- Must have a BEGINNING, MIDDLE and END need a climatic moment (a turning point).
 Tell a STORY. It can be in any genre.
- Any given clip can not be longer than 10 seconds.
- At least one scene must be set at RHS.
- You must use at least three clip **effects**. These must be chosen BEFORE filming and be a part of your storyboard/shot list. (slo mo, green screen, split screen, AE...)
- Must include creative camera work (dutch angle, crane shot, slider shot, steady cam, drone, etc)
- Be creative and original. **All shots must be originally shot by your group**. No clips from the internet allowed. *No friends or family may handle the camera*.
- Lighting design should be purposeful may use gels, strobe, lighting effects, etc
- Have consistent costuming/props that fit your chosen **genre.** Your video can be set in any decade.
- Edit to the beat/rhythm...not just a bunch of shots to the music.
- You must have a <u>Pitch Sheet</u>, <u>Shooting Schedule</u>, <u>Storyboard</u>, <u>Shotlist</u> completed and approved with your music before you begin production.
- No violence, guns, booze, drugs or inappropriate school behavior. Avoid using logos in costuming (if possible)
- NO REVERSING HALF THE VIDEO. NOTHING BAD ON PURPOSE. You are showing your skills in AV. Your video can, however, be cheesy.
- Do NOT remake the original video, even if it tells a story. You may honor the original in some way (rotoscoping in *Take on Me*, a zombie appears in *Thriller*...).
- First dibs: no two groups can use the same song! Get the LYRICS!
- IMPORTANT: You will be splitting your song into equal parts, and each group member is responsible for editing their section.

Sounds great, but what is a Narrative Music Video?

A narrative music video tells a story, logically or sequentially through a chain of events that are put together to run parallel to each other. At times it may even seem like a little film that stars a

main character who communicates with the audience.

When creating your narrative, you should remember these points:

- 1. Your story must have a beginning, middle and end.
- 2. Your story must have at least one lead character who engages the audiences through their thoughts, feelings and experiences.
- 3. There should be a relationship between the content of your song (style, voice, lyrics) and the content of the narrative (fact, context, iconography, visuals, etc.) for your audience to recognize.
- 4. Your narrative can follow either of these styles:
 - .lllustrative Where the visuals provide a literal representation of the lyrics
 - Amplifying Where key meanings and effects are repeated to manipulate the audiences.
 - Contradicting Where the visuals contrast with the music.

6. Create your story from the following genres

GRADING BASED ON

Story

- Clear beginning, middle, end
- Compelling/interesting/creative
- At least two characters

Camera work

- Utilizes variety of shots and angles with purpose
- ALWAYS uses the RULE OF THIRDS
- Shots are white-balanced
- Avoids stagnant shots
- Creative camera work

Lighting

- Lighting is purposeful and creative. Utilizes lighting effects.
- Must have at least one indoor scene with a three point lighting setup.

Editing

- Cleanly edited, to the beat
- Strong pacing
- Cuts on action
- Uses at least three special effects

Song title/artist appears in video

SCHEDULE

April 17: Intro to assignment, brainstorming

- Team set up (3 4 members)
- Song selection
- Set up shared folder
- Job assignments (directing/cinematography, storyboarding, shotlist, costuming/props, lighting, editing)

Every member needs a specific pre-production job they are in charge of!

April 19 - 23: Pre-production

- Story Synopsis/Pitch Sheet
- Characters/costumes/props
- Shot list
- Storyboard
- Shooting locations/schedule

April 23 - May 3: Filming

- Mini-lessons on lighting, green screen, etc
- Team shares filming duties

May 6 - 15: Editing

- Mini-lessons on effects, After-Effects, song marking
- Teams share editing duties
