As we transition into the new school year, we reflect on the many celebrations along the way. The 2021-2022 school year saw the return of our virtual students to in-person learning on a full time basis, and while we battled COVID laws for the first two thirds of

the year, our students and staff finished strong!

One of our big celebrations is our third graders returning to pre-pandemic pass rates on the IREAD assessment. With this being the first indication of growth on standardized tests, we see this as a harbinger for continued success as we move to catch up from all of the learning left on the table since March 2020. Our teachers and students have been simply amazing!

Of course, we are exceptionally grateful to our community for supporting the operating referendum in May. This amazing support of our schools will allow us to maintain our relatively small average class sizes, as well as increase the pay for our teachers and classified staff to levels that are much more competitive for today's market.

Additionally, we are incredibly thankful that we will now be able to hire a school resource officer for each of our schools and two for the high school. We are humbled by the vote of confidence from our community, whose investment in our school demonstrates a commitment to provide the best opportunities for our children and the entire Mt. Vernon community to thrive.

REFERENDUM PASSES

The Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation thanks and commends our entire community for their engagement and support of the \$.17 operating referendum, which voters approved during the May 3 Indiana Primary.

Because of this community support, Mt. Vernon will be able to maintain the programming and low class sizes that contribute to MVCSC being among the state's top performing school districts.

Referendum funds also will be allocated to hire more school resource officers so that each building will have security presence and the high school will have two officers. In addition, teachers' salaries will increase and our classified staff pay will increase to a more competitive level. This will help MVCSC attract and retain staff members who are essential to providing the kind of high quality learning experiences that prepare our students for success and maintain a strong community. Our Operations Fund will be sustainable, as the referendum revenue will help replace the loss of our 10-year increment funds.

Just as MVCSC made every effort to inform the community of all issues and facts leading up to the May 3 vote, continued school transparency and communication will be shared with the community through newsletters and opportunities to get involved with Mt. Vernon.

The students started the day with the National Anthem and a walk around the track. The elementary students then rotated through various fun activities that were located in the middle of the track, such as: jumping over mini hurdles, running relay races, throwing plastic javelins (pool noodles), and long jumping.

The Mini-Marauder Preschool (MMP) also hosted a Unified Champions field day on May 23. It started with the National Anthem and students stating the Unified Champions motto. Then all of the students rotated through various activity stations set up in the center of the Middle School track.

STUDENT REGISTRATION & CLASS SCHEDULES

Class schedules/homeroom assignments will be available in Skyward prior to each school's Open House night.

Returning Students Registration Beginning July 12: MV parents/guardians in Family 1 need to register ALL returning students through their Skyward Family Access account starting Tuesday, July 12 at 9:00am. It is important registration be completed **PRIOR** to the first day of school. *(This includes 2022-23 Kindergarten students who were enrolled at the Mini Marauders Preschool at the end of the 2021-22 school year, as well as returning Out-of-District/Transfer students who received an approval letter in June.)*

New Students: All students NEW to the district will need to complete the New Student Online Enrollment Application, including the new Out-of-District/Transfer students who are new to our district and have received an approval letter in June. Please be patient; new student online applications might be processed when staff returns for the 2022-23 school year (See School Office Summer Hours.) For this reason, families should know that they may not be contacted immediately by the school when they complete an application during the summer if the office is not open.

PAY FOR MEALS IN 2022-23: Parents/guardians should prepare for meal prices to increase for the 2022-23 school year due to market demands for food and supplies. Current legislation no longer allows schools to feed all children for free. Parents/guardians might want to familiarize themselves with e-Funds (www.mvcsc.k12.in.us/Content2/554), MVCSC's online payment system, and consider opening an account. Please communicate with your child if they are to eat breakfast &/or lunch. Any child that enters the food line will be charged for their meal. Negative balances will be sent to collections.

Please note: E-Funds will not be available as Skyward updates July 1 to 11.



Meal Assistance: In 2022-23, MVCSC will return to processing applications for free and reduced-price meal benefits. This application can be found after July 12 through your Skyward Family Access by opening the Food Service tab and clicking on Applications. Students eligible for free or reduced lunch assistance may also qualify for textbook rental fee assistance; watch for textbook rental assistance option in the online application.

Student IDs in Lunch Line: Students need to wear their student ID (given in the first few weeks of school) to the cafeteria for all meals and should wear them throughout the day. The purpose of wearing ID's is for security purposes as well as helping with the speed of the lunch line, giving students more time to eat.



SCHOOL FEES

PAY FOR SCHOOL MEALS: Parents/guardians may deposit funds into their child's lunch account through Mt. Vernon's online payment portal, e-Funds, or send in check or cash. Please review the meal costs and maintain a positive account balance for your child(ren). Negative balances will be sent to collections. As of the time of this printing, the state legislature does not allow free meals for all children during the 2022-23 school year. Free meals were available for all students because of pandemic-related federal waivers during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years only

Paying Textbook Rental Fees: Textbook rental fees are due at the beginning of the school year for grades K-5 after they are posted in Skyward. Grades 6-12 course fees will be billed once schedules are finalized, normally after the start of school. MVCSC strongly prefers payments be made through E-Funds via credit card or ACH; however, MVCSC will also accept cash and checks. Please see eFunds on the website for transaction fees.

Free & Reduced Lunch/Textbook Fees Assistance: The Application for textbook rental fee assistance may be found after July 12 through Skyward Family Access by opening the Food Service tab and clicking on Applications. Students eligible for free or reduced lunch assistance may also qualify for textbook rental

fee assistance; watch for textbook rental assistance option in the online application.

Device Protection Plan: It is recommended that parents/guardians purchase a protection plan for each student's Chromebook. The device will be protected after payment is received. Elementary school and MVMS parents will receive protection plan information at Back to School nights. Parents who opt for the plan may pay when they pay student fees. High School parents may purchase a protection plan online just prior to the start of the school year.

SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION

Bus stop pick-up times: On the first day of school, students should be waiting at their bus stop 30 minutes early. Approximate pick-up times with bus number and driver will be set within a few days of the start of school and posted on the MVCSC Transportation Department's web page at that time.

Out-of-District/Transfer Students' Transportation: A reminder that a child may ride only the bus they are assigned at the pickup and drop off location identified by the school corporation. If the child is riding the bus, a parent/guardian agrees to supervise the child before/after school at the assigned bus stop.

EARLY RELEASE WEDNESDAYS

On Early Release Wednesdays, the school day is shortened 45 minutes. Bus routes will depart 45 minutes earlier.

- The first and last Wednesday of the year will be a regular release (no Early Release Wednesday).
- 2-Hour Delays on a Wednesday would have a regular release (no Early Release Wednesday) on that day.

YMCA AFTER SCHOOL CARE

After-school care through the YMCA will be offered at all elementary schools. To register, see the website's "parents" tab and the "resources" webpage: mvcsc.k12.in.us/content2/ymca.

UP-TO-DATE IMMUNIZATIONS

Indiana law requires each child enrolled in school to be completely immunized against communicable diseases. Required vaccinations for the 2022-23 school year can be found on the MVCSC Health Services website page.

All records must be on file before the child can attend classes. If your child has received vaccinations over the summer, please submit a copy to your school of attendance or to the Corporation Nurse via fax# (317) 482-4113 or email tracy.furnas@mvcsc.k12.in.us.
