Taste: I included two pages, but I feel like sweet and sour are easy to draw. I will only complete that page. However, the prompt includes salty and bitter so I included those pages as an option.

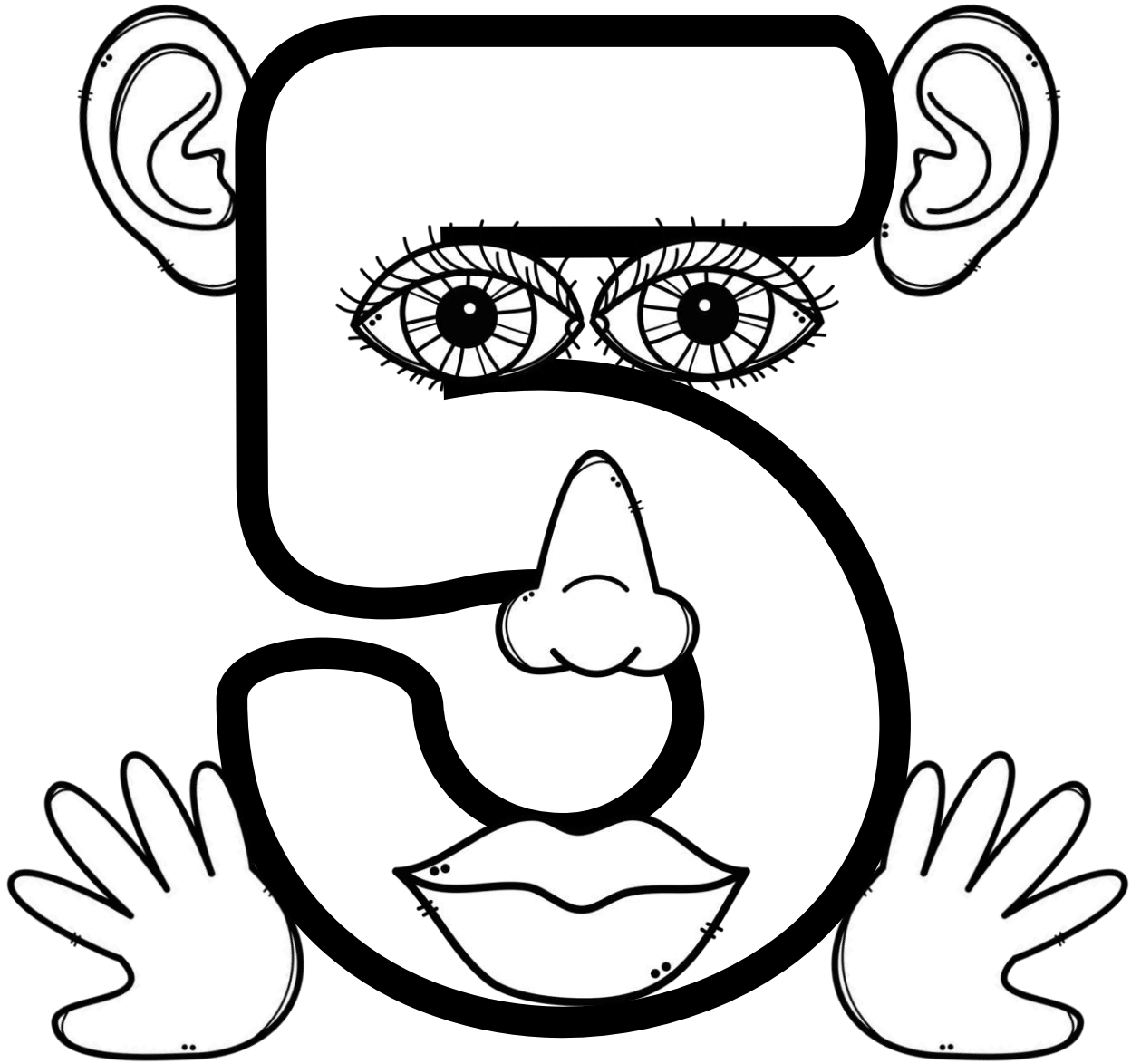
