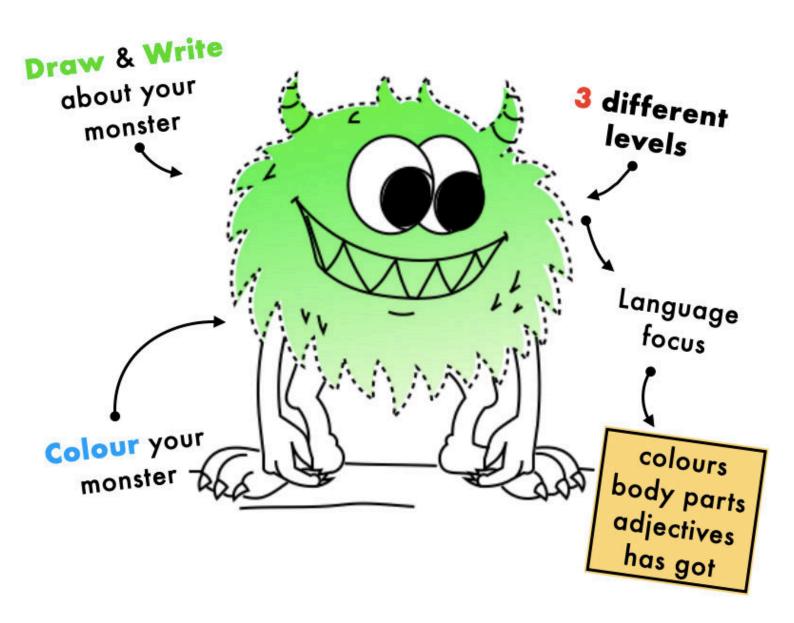
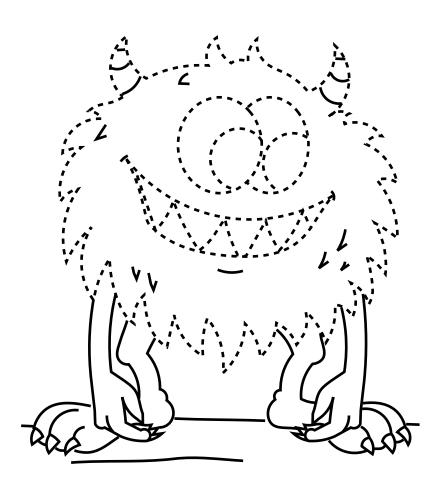

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Teacher Notes

3 x worksheets; each worksheet is graded.

Grade 1

Language focus: COLOURS

The children trace or draw the monster and colour their monster.

Encourage them to use at least 4 colours.

The children write the colours of the monster. They also need to complete the last 2 sentences. If this is too challenging, the teacher can compete the sentences so they only need to write the colours.

Grade 2

Language focus: COLOURS & BODY PARTS

The children draw and colour their monster.

The children write the colours of the body parts. NOTE: a red head | red eyes - omit 'a' when the noun is plural.

Grade 3

Language focus: HAS GOT & BODY PARTS

The children draw, colour and describe their monster.

Encourage them to use colours, adjectives and body parts.

e.g My monster has got a green head.

My monster is scary and ugly.

Possible adjectives:

small | scary | short | furry | ugly
