

Gaea marries Uranus → together, they have: Hundred-Handed Giants (3)
Cyclopes (3)
(all six are sent to Underworld)

together, they also have the 13 titans

Kronos, the youngest of 13 titans, agrees to help his mom, Gaea

↓
uses sickle to mutilate his father, Uranus (a move to punish and seize power)

Uranus' blood seeps into earth = Furies (3)
More Giants
Aphrodite (sea foam)

Theme/Moral of Story: A message that can be taken from this story is that cruelty will always be punished. It might take a while for vengeance to come, but it always will.

Connection to Our Modern World (These should be specific/detailed. Research, as needed): This was seen in the Arab Spring revolts of 2011, when several Middle Eastern countries, including Tunisia, Egypt, Libya, and Yemen, all had rulers ousted from power after civil uprisings. In Libya, for example, power was stripped from long-time dictator Muammar Gaddafi, who was killed in a military clash. Gaddafi had a long history of torturing and killing dissenters. His death was similarly brutal.
