Parent Survival Guide to Student Led Conferences and Frequently Asked Questions /

Why Student Led Conferences?

Leadership is one of our core ethical values at Nitschmann Middle School. What better way for our students to demonstrate **personal responsibility and accountability** for their academic performance than by leading their own conference! Student-led conferences are a positive alternative to traditional parent-teacher conferences. Parents and students engage in an open and honest dialogue about learning, and students develop important organizational and oral communication skills as they present their portfolio of work.

What can I expect at the Conference?

At the conference, your child will do most of the talking as he or she shares work samples and discusses progress and goals in each class. Then, you will have the opportunity to ask questions. You may want to ask your child why they received a certain grade, if they interact well with his/her teacher, or how much time they devoted to a certain project (see our list of suggested questions). Sixth grade parents may want to ask how their child is adapting to middle school, while eighth grade parents may want to begin to talk about the transition to high school.

How are the teachers involved in Student Led Conferences?

In student led conferences, the spotlight is on the most important person in the process: **The student**. While the core team teachers (math, science, social studies, and English) will be in the room, **they will not be directly involved in your discussions with your child**. They are available to support the students if needed, to clarify points, or answer questions. Since many conferences are going on at once, they have a very limited time to speak with parents. Encore teachers will also be available for you and your child to ask quick questions or give clarifications.

How do I sign-up?
