He realized he had a talent and was eventually able to quit being a lawyer and make money selling his sculptures.





Much of his work is designed to teach lessons. This piece is about how you can not always avoid road blocks and that you sometimes need to overcome challenges.






Aside from 3-D sculptures he also creates flat "paintings using small Legos.



Art adds color and richness to life.

































Love is a funny thing. Sometimes it is heartfelt. Sometimes it is heartache. Sometimes it **is just** heartburn.
