Totem pole

1	Totem poles were built by about 30 Native American tribes living along the Northwest Pacific coast of North America.
2	They are wooden towers, carved with images of animals and symbols about a tribe.
3	The totem poles told a story about their lives.
4	Nine different animals were used on the totem poles.
5	Totem poles are usually made out of large trees such as the Red Cedar tree.
6	Some of the animals include the eagle, bear, raven, wolf, whale, shark, frog, beaver, and thunderbird.
