Welcome & Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Steve Halldorson, Governing Board President, at 12:30 p.m.

Review of Agenda

Board Minutes Approval

Financial Report

Jennifer Carlson reviewed the current financial report on pages 9-10. The June 30, 2022 report was reviewed, as well as the November 9, 2022 report which included the updated 2022-2023 budget. Kent Dennis motioned to approve the financial report; Robert Bubach seconded; motion carried.

NESC Operations

NESC/DLPS Fiscal Operations Agreement

An updated agreement between NESC and DLPS for fiscal services on pages 11-12 was reviewed and discussed; cost for services is requested at \$70,000.00 per year. A motion was made to approve the agreement by Daren Johnson and seconded by Jean Callahan, motion carried. The NESC will explore options for the possibility of independent fiscal operations starting next fiscal year.

NESC Staffing Update

Instructional Coach

Dawn Johnson is working directly with teachers from Warwick and Minnewaukan schools. Her contract is covered by an agreement with the districts for days of service throughout the 2022-2023 school year. With the award of the NYCP grant, this will cover the fiscal side of the Minnewaukan agreement, with the work focusing specifically on the NYCP project goals.

School Improvement Specialist

Alyson Parsley is working with schools identified as receiving Targeted and Comprehensive Support from the ND Department of Public Instruction in the NESC region as well as another school from the NCEC REA. The work is focused with the leadership teams from each school.



Professional Learning Specialist

The NESC will post this position opening to the statewide hiring listservs at the end of December. It will be funded 60% from the NDSS statewide grant and 40% from the NESC and/or other projects.

NESC Website Update

The revised NESC website is currently under the final stages of updates with Tellwell out of Fargo. They will also be updating the ConnectEd site.

NESC Cognia Engagement Review

The NESC was scheduled for a review this fall of 2022, but it has been moved back to the 2024-2025 school year after changes were made with the ND review cycles.

Grants/Professional Learning

US Department of Education Native Youth Community Project (NYCP)

The NESC was recently notified of the grant award for a five-year project with the goals to increase college and career readiness for secondary students and increase awareness of and pathways to the teaching profession. The focus is on Minnewaukan High School with additional partnerships between the University of Jamestown as well as the Spirit Lake Tribe and Devils Lake Public Schools. Pages 25-26 include more information on the project.

NDREA – DPI High Impact Tutor Training Grant

Last fall, DPI offered a grant to the REAs for training of paraprofessionals and/or tutors statewide. The NESC and SEEC were approved to provide the plan and administration for this project, which will provide the option for schools to participate in Master Teacher PD (online platform with 150+ courses; annual subscription paid directly by NESC - page 28 has more information), or in Safe and Civil Schools (SCS) PD, such as Assisting the Teacher workshops. The next SCS workshop is on January 16, 2023, and registration is open now. This is a great opportunity for paras to have high-quality PD;



consider sending school-day or afterschool staff to this workshop. Information is on pages 27-34 of the board packet.

ND DPI Family Engagement Grant

The *Planning for School, Family and Community Partnerships* is a workshop series for leadership teams (Joyce Epstein framework for family engagement / Johns Hopkins University). Erin Lacina and Cortney Shuley from the NESC are Certified Trainers in the Epstein model of family engagement. Several cohorts are in progress this year, including two NESC member districts. The plan is for more PD cohorts to be available next year.

DPI NDSS Grant

The NESC, SEEC and CREA were awarded a collaborative grant from DPI to support schools' implementation of the ND State Content Standards through September of 2024. ND Standards-Based Learning frameworks, resources, and professional learning are in development with more to be available to schools during the 2022-23 school year. Grade K-12 proficiency scales for Science, Social Studies, and Health were developed by state workgroups in June.

NDSS Professional Learning

NDSS Professional Learning: There is a Marzano led workshop being planned for June 7-8, 2023 with the focus on using proficiency scales in the classroom. Prioritized Instructional Planning will also be available this Spring through the ND Education Learning Hub: <u>https://my.ndeducationalhub.org/login/index.php</u>. Registration will be open soon for each of those offerings.

NDSS Resources: A new ND Standards-Based Learning website is being developed to support the NDSS initiative and ND schools' implementation. It will be released soon. Currently, resources are housed at http://www.ndrea.org/index.php?id=112.

ND DPI Assessing to Inform Grant: This is a two-part webinar series available for free to all schools through a grant to the NESC. Supports are available for STAR, AIMSweb, FastBridge, NWEA, ACT, and Assessment Overview. Phase 1 focuses on Universal Screeners; Phase 2 focuses on Diagnostics. Student Activities

21st CCLC Grant

The new 3-year application for the NESC 21st CCLC Grant was approved in June 2022. We have two new sites joining our grant this year: Fessenden/Bowdon Elementary and Midkota High School (Glenfield). In total, the NESC has 20 sites for the next 3-year grant cycle.

Technology Learning Cooperative The 2022-2023 full rotation is included in the board packet on page 42.

Scrubs Camp: The NESC was awarded the Scrubs Camp grant from UND Rural Health to host a two-day camp on March 30 & 31, 2023 at LRSC. To date, 411 fifth graders are slated to attend.

ITV: There is one high school ITV class being offered this year between NESC schools (DL and Starkweather). Langdon receives two classes outside of the NESC, and LRSC has one dual credit ITV class going to Edmore. Dan Driessen from LRSC reported that classes have nearly all moved over to online formats.

ConnectEd is available live each Tuesday at 3:45 p.m. Lessons (lesson plans, resources, and videos) are archived on the ConnectEd website (engineering, arts, college/career readiness, and ND State Historic Site virtual field trips). We will be continuing this program throughout 2022-23 with fiscal support from the ND Afterschool Network Million Girls Moonshot Grant and the ND Council on the Arts.
