

NEST Syllabus: 9th/10th Grade

Program Overview

- NEST is a required class. Each NEST group consists of a cohort of students in the same grade and a certified teacher who advises the group for all four years.
- NEST will meet from 9:35 to 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, and from 9:40 to 11:10 a.m. on Friday for grade-specific content and Office Hour Time.
- During Office Hours, all students will first go to NEST to take attendance, and students must have a prearranged Office Hours Pass in order to leave the classroom during Office Hours.
- NEST is a Pass/Fail class and earns one Career Education credit over four years (.25 per year).

NEST provides weekly lessons that are grade level specific to support your Personalized Learning Portfolio as well as preparing a plan for your future.

NEST implementation plan

Class of 2017: .25 credit (Senior NEST)

Class of 2018: .50 credit (Junior and Senior NEST)

Class of 2019: .75 credit (Sophomore, Junior, and Senior NEST)

Class of 2020: 1.0 credit (Full Implementation)

The EPHS NEST Program will provide:

 - Freshman: 5 hours
 - Sophomore: 10 hours
 - Junior: 20 hours
 - Senior: 15 hours (by end of first semester)
- Reflective Essay- second semester Senior year
- Student Led Conferences- 2 per year
- Organization

*Students will earn .25 credit per year of school for a total of 1 elective credit by the end of their Senior year.
