Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-2022 educational progress for New Options High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-2022 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-2017. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

New Options High School is an alternative setting that services students who prefer a smaller setting, self-paced curriculum, and/or struggled to be successful in a traditional environment. The school delivers curriculum in an online format and allows students to move at their own pace —either faster or slower- than their classmates. New Options seeks to help students reach their educational goals by following the Michigan Merit Curriculum and using more flexible attendance and delivery models.
