### Aligning K-12 English Language Arts Priority Standards

This year, K-12 teachers have been collaborating by looking at the Indiana State Standards grade level by grade level. They have identified the "must know" standards with the goal of aligning them by the quarter(s) of when they will be covered and creating common formative assessments (skill checks). Jen Sass, NPUSC's Curriculum Director, explains, "Aligning our standards (skills) throughout the grade levels and using the common skill assessments will ensure we are building our students' knowledge base skill by skill every year." She also credited teachers for their efforts, "Our teachers have embraced this large task with gusto and with a growth mindset. Their hard work and collaboration pays off HUGE for ALL of our students."

### **New Prairie Middle School**

NPMS has been focusing on building and rebuilding positive student-teacher relationships. After looking at research and brainstorming a few changes, teachers and staff started the school year off with a schoolwide assembly the first day of school. At the assembly, administrators went over typical topics like

expectations and rules but added a fun twist for the students. They played tug of war and even had a messy egg toss in which Principal Justin Holmquest and Assistant Principal Kris Staats won. Students were both surprised and irritated to learn that the principals had been using a hard-boiled egg! Principal Holmquest used this as a learning opportunity: "During the school year, some of



you might try to bend the rules or make mistakes. It is important for you to own your mistakes and learn from them. And, you might have to face consequences." He then let a student smash a couple of raw eggs on his head, which lightened the mood back up. With this small act of fun on the first day of school, the stage was set for a great year!

Additionally, in order to promote more fun and deeper relationships, NPMS has added some special events:

- Quarterly incentives for students who meet certain academic and behavior benchmarks
- · An additional school dance
- Staff vs. student basketball game (raising money for NPHS's HOSA team)
- Spirit week leading up to the game

### **Prairie View Elementary**



PVES has been emphasizing their Bobcat BEST this year, which stands for Be Prepared, Encourage Others, Show Respect and Take Pride. Administration and staff created an introductory video specifically showing expectations for these behaviors in various locations in the

school. Along with the video, PVES now has additional signage throughout the building to help remind students. Students work to show their Bobcat BEST each week in hopes of taking home the Bobcat BEST Trophy which is awarded to classes exemplifying the schoolwide expectations. When classes win the trophy, they can also choose their own reward like an extra recess, picnic lunch with a guest reader or earning a Bobcat Buck.

Not only that, but PVES also began an attendance challenge where the grade level with the highest average attendance at the end of each quarter earns a special hands-on science lesson with the principal. The first award went to the fourth grade classes that read a story from Dr. Seuss; learned about solids, liquids and gases; and made their own Oobleck. This quarter, there will be a lesson on salt and how it's used on roads and sidewalks to melt



ice. Students will also learn how it helps make ice cream!
Principal Justin Heinold shares, "Students are naturally competitive. Staff have overheard conversations from students encouraging one other to be their BEST in order to win the trophy. We also keep a display up in the cafeteria for the attendance challenge so that students can see how close they are."



### HOSA Group Pursues Additional "Heart-Safe" Designations

NPHS's HOSA-Future Health Professions is an extracurricular academic team for students who have an interest in pursuing a career in healthcare. This group has many opportunities to learn, lead, serve and innovate including attending the Indiana state leadership conference and competing against other students in selected events.







schools and communities to prepare for a cardiac emergency, the leading cause of death of students at school. To achieve a designation, schools must evaluate their facilities on AED placement, staff/student training, establish a cardiac emergency response plan and practice a cardiac emergency drill at least twice a year. In 2021, NPHS was the first school in the entire state of Indiana to be named a Project ADAM Heart Safe School! Now, New Prairie Middle School and Rolling Prairie Elementary School are receiving their designations in February 2023.



Mark Mayfield

This initiative started with the unfathomable. In 2017, NPHS senior Mark Mayfield lost his life after suffering sudden cardiac arrest during an intramural basketball game. In 2019, Tonya Aerts, PLTW Biomedical Science Teacher and NPUSC HOSA Advisor, discovered the Project ADAM organization and worked tirelessly to establish an affiliation in Indiana and to secure NPHS as the first Indiana designation. Aerts shares, "This mission continues to provide multiple opportunities to students who want to get involved on a different level. We started with a campaign of awareness and have grown into a quest for change. This is because of students who want to take a chance at something they have never done before and grow in their leadership skills to something they never imagined. We will never be 'done' with our mission to educate others on sudden cardiac arrest and empowering others to act if someone needs help." Not

only has NPUCS been greatly affected by Project ADAM, but the program is growing across the state.

Aerts also reflected on this journey, "Our school experienced a student death to sudden cardiac arrest. That is our history and a reminder that sudden cardiac arrest can happen to anyone, anytime, anywhere. Mark Mayfield may have lost his life to sudden cardiac arrest at New Prairie High School, but he inspired a movement to save lives across Indiana."

### Bringing Back the Fun at School After the Pandemic

For the 2022-23 year, NPUSC administration and teachers have focused on bringing fun back to the school year post pandemic. Each school has done unique things within setting expectations for student behavior. Additionally, all three elementary schools are working on the state designation of family friendly school which allows them the opportunity to reflect and grow.
