


During the next two weeks there will be many celebrations at Sunquam. Please keep in mind that all cars parked on the bus platform **MUST** be moved by 2:45 PM.



The third grade curriculum has a heavy focus on learning to play the recorder. The reason for this is that, students have an opportunity to join the band or orchestra in fourth grade. The recorder is a perfect instrument to use as a "stepping stone" to the actual instruments they can learn to play in fourth grade. The third graders have all received their recorders. We have learned in a short amount of time: proper posture, how to hold the recorder properly with correct fingerings, to read notation on treble clef, quarter notes, half notes, tonguing and phrasing. I feel that is very important for students to be exposed to a wide variety of music. The fifth graders have finished a unit on the great Baroque composer George Frideric Handel. We have also studied Johann Sebastian Bach. We will soon embark on a journey to learn about opera. The composer we will study is Gioacchino Rossini. 
# 「學對THOUGHTS FOR PARENTS 图對
