Harper Construction

Harper is set to start construction on campus in addition to the ongoing parking lot project. Currently, a remodeling project to waterproof the landing is underway. I have highlighted important items and dates below.

Project will start on 4/7 and will last approximately 45 days.

We should be complete by end of May.

This will affect the **stairs to the second floor and also the tunnel** on the first floor in front of the elevator.

The area from the memorial garden into the roundabout will be fenced off to traffic during this project.

Also the doors exiting into the tunnel and onto the front stairs will be closed to all non-emergency traffic.

If you use the front stairs or tunnel for normal daily traffic, we are asking you use the first floor door instead.

The visitor parking lot will still be active with signage pointing students and visitors to the first floor door by HP112.

Expect some construction noise.

Greetings Harper Families!

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. The U.S Department of Health and Human Services reminds all of us that "strong, nurturing communities that are supportive of families can get involved and play a role in preventing child abuse and neglect and promoting child and family well-being."

Schools are an integral part of preventing child abuse and neglect. Over the next few weeks, activities will be occurring across the district and community to promote awareness and help children know how, when, and where to reach out for assistance. You may see pinwheel gardens planted at school locations, receive brochures created by school counselors sharing their efforts, and hear your child speak about morning announcements used to increase school-wide awareness.

Some activities will be shared via social media using two hashtags: #PassThePinwheel and #CMSPinwheel. Finally, all students in CMS will receive an age-appropriate lesson on the topic of harassment and bullying. The lesson will help students define harassment and bullying, practice their response to such actions, identify an adult to come to with any problem, and understand how to help someone else experiencing harassment and bullying. 

Prom Dress Code Guidelines

A high school prom is a formal event. We are looking forward to an elegant and enjoyable event for all participants. Attire must be appropriate for high school students. Please see the dress code guidelines and pictures provided. If you are uncertain about your attire, please seek administrative approval prior to purchasing or renting your attire.

Dress Guidelines for Young Men:

Pants must be worn appropriately. No sagging.

Collared dress shirt with sleeves and worn with a tie (exception: tux shirt with a decorative button). Shirts must remain on and tucked in for the entire dance.

Dress pants (no jeans).

Jackets or blazers.

No bandannas, chains, or canes.

Dress Guidelines for Young Ladies

The back of the dress may not be lower than the natural waistline (belly button)

Upper and lower body must be covered.

No see-through material which exposes excessive cleavage or private areas.

Slits may not be higher than fingertip length.

Pantsuits must be of a formal nature (no jeans).

Once a year, the British American Business Council of North Carolina sponsors the ACS British Studies program, an all expense paid, twelve day study/travel visit to the United Kingdom that strives to bring British history to life by enabling students to explore and connect with 400 years of British history. Only four Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS) students are able to attend. Kudos Liam Roeth



As you know, in October all Juniors took the PSAT across the country. All Juniors who took the PSAT were automatically enrolled into the National Merit Scholarships Program. Out of the 1.5 million program entrants, 50,000 of theses students will be recognized in the fall for being among the highest-scoring participants. Our very own Liam Roeth has been identified as one of those individuals. He will go on to compete to become one of the 16,000 semifinalist to represent the state North Carolina. Liam Roeth son of Neil and Cynthia Roeth and a Junior at Harper Middle College High School, earned the highest possible ACT composite score of 36. On average, less than one-tenth of 1 percent of students who take the ACT earn a top score. In the U.S. high school graduating class of 2016, only 2,235 out of nearly 2.1 million graduates who took the ACT earned a composite score of 36.

The ACT consists of tests in English, mathematics, reading and science, each scored on a scale of 1–36. A student's composite score is the average of the four test scores. Some students also take the optional ACT writing test, but the score for that test is reported separately and is not included within the ACT composite score.

In a letter to the student recognizing this exceptional achievement, ACT Chief Executive Officer Marten Roorda stated, "Your achievement on the ACT is significant and rare. While test scores are just one of multiple criteria that most colleges consider when making admission decisions, your exceptional ACT composite score should prove helpful as you pursue your education and career goals."
