Upon completion of the course, the successful student will be eligible to take the NNAAP (National Nurse Aide Assessment Program) test and become a Certified Nurse Aide I in the state of NC. The curriculum is a collaboration of the NC Board of Nursing (NCBON), the NC Division of Health Service Regulation (NCDHS) and the NC Department of Public Instruction.

- Late work will impact an assignment grade as follows: 1 day late = -10 points, 2 days late = -20 points, 3 days late = -40 points. After 3 days a zero will be assigned. It is the student's responsibility to initiate make-up work upon return to class.
