

School Features

Homeroom/Instructional Support Time - Provides a space each week for teachers to develop effective and positive relationships with students and between students. Additionally it provides 90 minutes of time for academic support, social emotional support. enrichment, assessment retakes/make-ups, and additional student support each week. Students are given guidance and choice in determining how they effectively use this time each week.

TV-10 – Provides a pragmatic environment that exposes students to the power and purpose of television and the broadcasting of information and entertainment to help tell the Farmington Public Schools' story.

Peer Mentorship/LINK Crew – LINK Crew is a high school transition program that increases freshmen success. Members of the junior and senior class are trained by teachers to be LINK Leaders who act as positive role models, motivators, and mentors that help guide freshmen to be successful during the transition to high school.

School-Based Leadership and Community Service – North offers a wide array of opportunities for students to gain leadership experience and/or give back to the community including LINK Crew, Class Boards and Student Senate, Student Round Table, Service Learning, Service Honor Code, Raider Nation, National Honor Society, Model United Nations, BPA, DECA, Skills USA, HOSA, PTSA Student Officers, Pretty Brown Girls, Diversity Club, Band, Marching Band, Orchestra, Choir, Theater, Buddies, Philanthropy Class, Robotics, and many others.

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

Farmington Public Schools has one of the largest CTE programs in Oakland County with a total of 11 programs in high skill, high wage, and high demand careers in Architecture & Design, Automotive Technology, Business Management, Computer Science, Cybersecurity, Engineering, Finance, Marketing, Medical Skills, TV-10 Broadcasting/Film Production, and Web Design.
