National Honor Society Selection Process

The Eseyami Chapter of National Honor Society closely follows the selection procedures set forth in the National Association of Secondary School Principals National Honor Society Handbook – 15th Edition.

Student's academic records are reviewed to determine scholastic eligibility (minimum cumulative gpa of 3.5 is required as set forth in the Eyesami Chapter Constitution). Students are notified of initial eligibility and invited to provide information on the Student Activity Information Form to the Faculty Selection Committee if they are interested in membership. The Student Activity Information Form is reviewed by the Faculty Selection Committee and points are assigned in the areas of Leadership, Service, and Character. Scholastic eligibility is NOT revisited by the Faculty Selection Committee. When using a point system, the cut-off point should be determined prior to reviewing candidates. Candidates receiving a majority vote of the Faculty Selection Committee should be inducted into the chapter. Students who are selected, and their parents, will be notified of their selection and given information regarding the induction ceremony and the obligations of membership in NHS.

The Student Activity Information Form is available as a Word document. It can be emailed to candidates for word processing.

It is important to note that selection to National Honor Society is not guaranteed simply because a student has achieved the minimum level of academic performance. The components of leadership, service, and character are carefully included in the selection process, and candidates' performance in all areas will be evaluated.
