Dear Readington Families,

Under federal guidelines, each state is required to implement a testing program for grades three through eight. The statewide assessments for mathematics, English Language Arts (ELA), and science are the *New Jersey Student Learning Assessments (NJSLA-Mathematics, NJSLA-ELA, and NJSLA-Science)*.

The testing dates and times for our students are listed below:

***Please note the change in date for the 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade NJSLA-Science assessments. This change was necessary do to an adjustment made to the testing window at the state level.***

NJSLA-Mathematics and ELA		
Grade 3	April 30 through May 5	Mathematics- 3 Units (60 minutes each) ELA- 2 Units (75 minutes each)
Grades 4-5	May 7 through May 12	Mathematics- 3 Units (60 minutes each) ELA- 2 Units (75 minutes each)
Grades 6-8	May 7 through May 12	Mathematics- 3 Units (60 minutes each) Algebra I & II- 2 Units (90 minutes each) ELA- 2 Units (90 minutes each)
NJSLA-Science		
Grades 5 and 8	Grade 5 May 20 & 21 Grade 8 May 19 & 20	4 Units (45 minutes each)
